

# Coordinator's Corner

The 2016-2017 school year begins with the entire Sophomore class engaging in the Middle Years Program project. This means that all 10<sup>th</sup> graders at Douglas County High School must pursue a topic of personal interest as part of a process of "inquiry, action and reflection." This also means that every faculty member at Douglas County High School is serving as an advisor for three to five students.

This process will be a major undertaking; and how we embrace this challenge will say a great deal about who we are as a community. When students explore subjects, and engage topics of interest they learn processes of discovery that extend well beyond the particular project. While it means "more work" (at least as we work out the details of implementation) we can be sure that this work promotes the ideals of education in a time when education drifts far too conveniently to the quantifiable and the measurable. Opportunities for young people to have meaningful conversations with adults about the exploration of topics make education authentic and relevant. Interpersonal skills, research skills and presentation skills all have real-life applications that value the pursuit of understanding and the sharing of discoveries. Education depends on developing connections between how students see the world and how they can creatively and reasonably expand their vision.

This process is part of being an "IB" school and will help develop our community by enabling all of us to be a part of a meaningful process. It promotes international understanding by valuing and activating curiosity and connecting discovery to global themes and perspectives. The links between the personal project and the expectations of the Diploma Program are explicit and clear. Both encourage students and teachers to utilize curiosity as the most powerful motivator for learning. The benefit for all students at Douglas County High School will become clear over the coming years as we invest in a common pursuit dedicated to and reflective of the diversity of interests within our student body.
