Spring IB Dance Performance Exhibits of Inspiration

This concert was inspired by research of the creation stories from the Australian Aboriginal book "Gadi Mirabooka: Tales from the Dreaming". In January 2016, the IB dance students were honored to host a week-long residency with guest artists from the NAISDA Dance College in Sydney, Australia. During the residency the IB dance students not only learned Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander dance traditions, but also worked one-on-one with each guest artist on choreographic form and blending traditional movement with contemporary dance styles. This residency culminated in a collaboration with DCHS feeder schools where the traditional Torres Islander Strait "Sitting Dance" was learned. The IB Dance students applied what they learned from this residency and collaboration to choreography developed for "Walkabout" on March 10th & 11th. "
